The Judge was educated in the country schools and in Oberlin, where he secured his A. B. Taught school in Lake county, in Illinois and Idaho. Was admitted to the Illinois Bar in 1888, and in Ohio, 1895. Practiced law till 1903, in Painesville, when elected Probate Judge. Renominated at the May primaries without opposition. He is a trustee of the Painesville Hospital, and chairman of the Board. His endowments to this institution have been large and his contributions continuous.

#### Hon. ARLINGTON G. REYNOLDS

Judge of the Court of Common Pleas

Is a native of Lake County, and was born in the Town of Mentor, November 24, 1849. He is the son of George W. and Honor S. (Nowlen) Reynolds. Obtained his education in the district schools, Collegiate Institute, Willoughby and Oberlin College. Read law with Judge G. N. Tuttle, and was admitted to the Bar in 1882. Practiced in Lake County till his election to the Common Pleas bench in 1910. Served two terms as probate judge, and two terms as mayor of Painesville. Elected to the Legislature in 1897, and re-elected in 1899. Served as speaker of the 74th Assembly. In 1909 was appointed Judge of the Court of Common Pleas, and elected the following year. Since 1898 has served as Trustee of Lake Erie College.
