I John C. Ward, County Surveyor of Lake County Ohio do hereby certify that on the 18th day of March 1907 at the request of M. C. Rathbun I surveyed the certain lot of land described as follows: Situated in the Village of Madison, County of Lake and State of Ohio, and is known as being a part of the Madison Woolen Factory lot in Range 6, Township 11, Tract 1, Connecticut-Western Reserve and is bounded as follows: Beginning at a stone marked thus \oplus set at the intersection of the east line of Eagle Street (formerly called Factory Street) with the north line of West Main Street (known also as the South Ridge Road); thence $N 86\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$ along the north line of West Main Street, 22 feet to an iron bolt; thence $N 5^{\circ} 20' W$ parallel with said Eagle Street, 45 feet to an iron pipe stake; thence $S 86\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} W$ parallel with north line of West Main Street, 22 feet to a hole drilled in the cement-side walk one foot west from the east edge of said walk and in the east line of said Eagle Street; thence $S. 5^{\circ} 20' E$. 45 feet to the place of beginning. Containing $\frac{23}{1000}$ of an acre of land.
