

In conformity to an act to enable the holders of land, within this state, to prosecute testimony relative to their tenures. Before January 2, 1824. I attended at the request of William & Cyrus Clark on the 20. & 21. of January instant, and made a survey of the lot of said William & Cyrus Clark and fixed the boundary of the same in accordance with the testimony of Abram Waile & Abel Clark. That is, commenced at the S.E. corner of section No. 5 Township No. 9 in Range No. 10, being also the S.E. corner of Freeman Lucas lot, at which place I caused a stake to be

set, from which a beech tree 12 inches in diameter bears  
S.  $29\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. fifteen links distant. also another beech tree 10 inches in diameter, bears S.  $65\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  W. fourteen links distant, marks on one side 1825 A. N. No. 9 - on the other 1815 S. S. B. No. 5. Hence run S.  $3\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E. on the E. line of T. Lucas lot, being also the E. line of said section No. 5 thirteen chains seventy five links to the S. E. corner of said T. Lucas lot, and the N. E. corner of said William & Cyrus Marks lot, and plantice a stake and stone, in presence of Daniel Prooker and John A. Stayton from which stake and stone a beech tree 15 inches in diameter bears N.  $22\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W. thirty four links distant. Hence run S.  $89\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  W. on the line <sup>of 1st</sup> between William & Cyrus Marks and Truman & Thomas Lead. fifty five chains, to a stake. Hence S.  $3\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E. nineteen chains & twenty eight links to a stake. Hence N.  $89\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E. fifty five chains to a stake stuck at the S. E. corner of said William & Cyrus Lot being also in the C. line of said section No. 5. Hence N.  $3\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  W. along the E. line of said section No. 5. seventeen chains & twenty eight links to the N. E. corner of William & Cyrus Marks lot. Daniel Prooker and John A. Stayton Chairmen, being present at the setting of all the bounds.
