Dear Mr. Hill:

By documents dated November 2000 and April 20, 2001, you submitted a request, pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-13, to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM), Northeast District Office (NEDO). The document titled Request for Authorization Under OAC 3745-27-13 LAK-640-3.44 Project Corridor Former Willoughby Solid Waste Landfill, Willoughby, Lake County, Ohio, was submitted by HZW Environmental Consultants, Inc. on behalf of the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), District 12.

ODOT is requesting authorization to install a storm sewer over a portion of the closed Willoughby Sanitary Landfill (WSLF) on Glenn Avenue for the purpose of improving drainage on State Route 20. The landfill is a former solid waste disposal facility that closed in the 1970s and contains primarily municipal solid waste from the City of Willoughby. The drainage improvement proposal consists of an open and closed system and ODOT anticipates unearthing approximately 268 cubic meters of waste as part of the excavation activities. Engineering controls include storage of excavated waste on an impermeable membrane, testing and characterizing the waste, removal and proper disposal of waste, and incorporating a cap design which meets OAC Chapter 3745-27, effective July 29. 1976, for work conducted within the limits of waste placement. Any solid waste encountered will be used as backfill within the footprint of the landfill or taken to an appropriate Ohio EPA permitted landfill. Any leachate encountered will be collected and treated as an industrial waste in accordance with Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 6111.

Based upon a review of the document, I have determined that the proposed activities will not result in a violation of applicable laws or regulations, will not create a nuisance, and are unlikely to adversely affect the public safety, human health, or the environment. Therefore,
